

## **The Gospel (please stand) Mark 3:20-35**

The crowd came together again, so that Jesus and his disciples could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, "He has gone out of his mind." And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons." And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered.

"Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin" -- for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit."

Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you." And he replied, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

**ANNOUNCEMENTS**

**MUSIC IN THE LITURGY:** Today we return to “Ordinary Time”, that long period between Pentecost and Advent. On this Second Sunday after Pentecost the lessons seem not to have a connecting theme. This is often true during “Ordinary Time.” But, in fact, all of the lessons indicate that what we humans desire is not always what God desires for us. So we must take to heart the Psalmist’s words; “The lord will make good his purpose for me.” The music in today’s liturgy, including the hymns, is selected to reflect that particular theme.

The **Offering Anthem** “Comfort, O Lord, the Soul of Thy Servant” is a brief section of a much larger work based on Psalm 86 by William Crotch (1775-1847), English organist, artist, and Professor of Music at Oxford University. He was a contemporary of Haydn, and the musical style of this brief Anthem bears a resemblance to that of Joseph Haydn’s older brother, Michael.

The **Organ Prelude**, by American Composer and Organist, Stephen Quesnel (b. 1950), is based on the hymn tune, St. Bride, and interprets a hymn text (not in the *Hymnal 1982*) which reflect today's theme:

*“Give to the winds thy fears; hope and be undismayed;  
God hears thy sighs and counts thy tears; God shall lift up thy head.  
Through waves, and clouds, and storms, he gently clears thy way;  
Wait thou his time; so shall this night soon end in joyous day.  
Leave to his sovereign sway to choose and to command;  
So shalt thou, wondering, own his way. How wise, how strong his hand!  
Far, far above thy thought his counsel shall appear,  
When fully he the work hath wrought that caused thy needless fear.”*

**The Organ Postlude** is by David Cherwien (b. 1957), a well known American Lutheran organist and improviser. It is a brief and robust interpretation for organ solo of our final hymn.

**SPECIAL MUSIC LITURGY:** Next Sunday, June 17, the St. John's Choir will sing the *Missa Brevis in D, (K.194)* by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart within the framework of the 10:30 AM Holy Eucharist. Mozart composed this “short Mass” for choir, four soloists, 2 violins, cello and organ. It should prove to be a very special liturgy.
