

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the LORD. Therefore thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. **The Gospel (please stand) Luke 23:33-43**

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. The people stood by, watching Jesus on the cross; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" ### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

**MUSIC IN TODAY'S LITURGY:** Today is the Last Sunday after Pentecost and Christ the King Sunday. As we do every week, we select music to correlate with the themes of the readings and prayers appointed for the day. The **Canticle** setting which the choir sings is an Anglican Chant setting by English organist and composer, Edward John Hopkins (1818-1901). The **Offering Anthem** is by Harold Friedell (1905-1958), organist/choir master for many years at Calvary Church and St. Bartholemew's Church in New York. It is a setting of a poem by metaphysical poet, George Herbert, and one of Friedell's most frequently performed compositions. The **Organ Prelude** is a "Choral" by Joseph Jongen (1873-1953), a Belgian organist, composer, and music educator. This "Choral" is not based on a hymn tune, but is in the French Organ Choral style in which an original chorale type melody is expanded thematically for organ. The **Postlude** is by British organist and composer, Francis Jackson (b. 1917), for 36 years the organist and Director of Music at Yorkminster. This brief fanfare was obviously composed for the procession of the Archbishop at some event at Yorkminster.

Two identical Handbell Concerts will begin at 1:00 and 2:15 PM, respectively. And if you appreciate fine organ music, Bill Clisham will play a casual recital of seasonal organ music from 3:30 – 5:00 PM while the church is open for visitors.
